The WasteReuse Association selected
LMU as the **2010 WasteReuse Customer**
of the Year for implementing a treatment
station which produces odorless, clean
irrigation water used on 75% of
campus landscapes.

In 2009, LMU **finished in the top 5%** in
key categories of RecycleMania, an annual
recycling competition involving over 500
colleges and universities nationally.

LMU was a recipient of the **2007**
California Interfaith Power &
Light Energy Oscar for Outstanding
Achievement in Energy Efficiency.

LMU has **three LEED** Certified
(Leadership in Energy and Environmental
Design) buildings.

LMU signed the American College &
University Presidents' Climate Commitment
in 2007, committing LMU to **reducing**
greenhouse gas emissions.
